# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In 2022, the Ukrainian Canadian Research and Documentation Centre (UCRDC) celebrated its 40th Anniversary. For the past 40 years, the UCRDC has consistently worked to implement its mission of "Preserving the Past for Future Generations" by expanding oral history projects, creating exhibits, holding webinars and publishing materials of interest to the Ukrainian Canadian community and beyond. The UCRDC has served as a reliable source of information for academics, students, filmmakers, journalists and all persons interested in Ukraine and Ukrainian-Canadians. The list of UCRDC completed and ongoing projects is lengthy and diverse, demonstrating the success of the UCRDC as an organization for 40 years. The efforts of the UCRDC Board of Directors, volunteers and administrators, some of whom have been active since 1982, are directly responsible for the organization's continued relevance and viability.

The challenges of the pandemic did not deter the work of the UCRDC in 2020 – 2022. Inter alia, the UCRDC held a virtual premiere of the film "A Canadian War Story," arranged several webinars, "The Women of Ravensbruck" in English and Ukrainian, "The Mennonite Holodomor Project: It's Complicated" and created an exhibit documenting the experiences of displaced Ukrainians following World War 2. In 2021, the UCRDC added a folk song project – "FOLK – UKRAINE.com," to its website. In 2022 the English version of the "Extraordinary Lives of Ukrainian Canadian Women" was presented at a book launch. The UCRDC has partnered with other organizations on joint projects, such as the Holodomor Research and Education Consortium (HREC) and the Ukrainian World Congress (UWC). The war in Ukraine intensified the work of the UCRDC. This global event heightened the need for the UCRDC to begin to document contemporary history, as the war in Ukraine had an immediate, wide-ranging impact throughout Canada. A recently created UCRDC project, "Canada Reacts, "intends to document Canada's multifaceted response to the war in Ukraine.

As the UCRDC enters its fifth decade of research and documentation, the future work of the UCRDC will continue to grow and evolve. Congratulations and Happy 40th Anniversary to the UCRDC, its Board of Directors, volunteers, sponsors and supporters. To many more years of researching, documenting and understanding the history of Ukrainian Canadians!

# OUR HISTORY

In April of 1982, various prominent Ukrainian-Canadians based in Toronto came together to establish the Ukrainian Famine Research Committee (UFRC) in order to commemorate the upcoming 50th anniversary of the Holodomor. The Committee consisted of seven original members: Jurij Darewych, Wasyl Janischewskyj, William Kereliuk, Nicholas Kushpeta, Bohdan Onyschuk, Peter Smylski, and Ostap Wynnyckyj. They decided to produce an English-language documentary film about the Holodomor. The Committee collected personal accounts from survivors and eyewitnesses of the famine living in Canada, the USA, and Western Europe, collaborating with numerous scholars already researching the Holodomor. Using the collected material, UFRC produced the film "Harvest of Despair," which premiered in Toronto in 1984. The film was well-received and screened at numerous film festivals, winning awards in New York, Columbus, Houston, Oakland, and other cities. A number of TV channels in Canada, the USA, the UK, Australia and other Western countries showed the film. Later versions were also produced in French, Spanish and Ukrainian languages.

During the production of "Harvest of Despair," an extensive collection of film footage, audio tapes, and textual documents was compiled. Not all of it was suitable nor used for the film, but the research proved invaluable. Thus, in 1986 the Committee incorporated as the Ukrainian Famine Research Centre and in 1989 changed its name to Ukrainian Canadian Research & Documentation Centre (UCRDC). An official archive was established, with Iroida Wynnyckyj as the head archivist. While continuing to encompass work on the Holodomor, the scope of research at the Centre was broadened to include the collection of archival material about Ukrainians in Canada, Ukrainians during WWII, displaced persons camps in post–World War II Europe, and other important topics.

In the following years, the UCRDC continued to produce and support the production of documentary films. In 1994, UCRDC assisted with the production of Yuriy Luhovy's film "Freedom Had a Price," a film about the internment of Ukrainian immigrants in Canada during WWII which premiered in 1994. In 2003 a new UCRDC film "Between Hitler and Stalin," directed by Slavko Novytski, recounts the events of WWII from a Ukrainian perspective. Most recently, in 2020, the Centre produced "A CANADIAN WAR STORY" by John Paskievich, which pays dramatic tribute to the Ukrainian Canadian military personnel who contributed to the Allied victory in WWII.

Over the years, the UCRDC developed an archive of oral history and other documentation that has been continuously used by various researchers and educators. It has hosted prominent scholars like Volodymyr Maniak, Anne Applebaum, Norman Davies, and many others. The UCRDC has played a prominent role in Canada in educating about Ukrainian history, Ukrainians in Canada, and the Holodomor, hosting workshops and talks for visiting students of all levels and ages. The Centre has sponsored and helped publish numerous research books, prepare visual exhibits, hold research conferences and lectures, and host book presentations and film screenings.

The work undertaken by UCRDC has received recognition and accolades from individuals, academic organizations and government institutions in Canada, Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Ukraine, the United States, and other countries. After 40 years, the Ukrainian Canadian Research & Documentation Centre remains one of Canada's primary sources of research material on various topics in Ukrainian history.

### The Mennonite Experience during the Holodomor: It's Complicated.

During the Holodomor (1932-33) Mennonites in Ukraine shared many of the same experiences of hunger and premature death as their neighbours. In 1933, after Hitler came to power in Germany, they were often accused by Soviet officials of being Nazi agents and Hitlerists for receiving foreign aid from relatives in the West.


